



SROODR002B – Drive a 4wd Vehicle in Difficult Terrain Using Advanced Techniques

This unit deals with the advanced skills and knowledge required to use appropriate range, gear and technique to drive a four wheel drive vehicle through and over difficult terrain.

The qualification is suitable for an Australian apprenticeship pathway and for VET in Schools delivery. Students are able to earn an industry recognised Certificate IV in Outdoor recreation with the option of two units being contributed to their Certificate IV in Tourism

Entry requirements

There are no entry requirements for this qualification.

Career opportunities/vocational outcomes

Include but not limited to Sports workers, Tour Guides, Mining Resources, Tour operator, building and construction workers.

Program Articulation

Students who successfully complete this course can get advanced standing in a range of other certificate IV level qualifications including those within in the Sport, Tourism, Hospitality and Events packages.

Program Duration

Full Time: 2 Days.

Course Commencement

Courses commence is all year round with the popular months of February, April, July and September each year for full time and part time applicants.

Delivery Methods

This course is delivered through blended face to face classroom and practical learning, online learning at students' self pace or by correspondence.

Assessment Methods

Students may be required to sit written and oral exams, participate in practical activities, complete assignments, presentations, vocational projects and role plays.

Students undertaking a course as part of a work based traineeship will be assessed in the workplace.

This unit will be assessed in conjunction with SRODR003B - Co-ordinate Recovery of a 4WD Vehicle Using Advanced Techniques

Recognition of Prior Learning

Participants with previous training and/or experience may apply for RPL. Participants, who have completed courses with equivalent / matching learning outcomes, will be granted credit transfer.
