



Pool Lifeguard Course

This course is for people who want to work in the Aquatic industry at pool side. This qualification aims to provide students with skills and knowledge for an individual to be competent in a range of activities and functions required to supervise swimming pool users, the program includes training and assessment of Lifeguarding skills and procedures including pool surveillance, aquatic emergency care and basic first aid, emergency management, introductory pool operations, oxygen resuscitation and aquatic spinal injury management.

Entry requirements

There are no entry requirements for this qualification. However Candidates must be 16 years of age and will be asked to demonstrate current competency in the following areas:

- Level 2 Senior First Aid qualification
- basic spinal management techniques
- ability to swim 200 metres
- ability to recover a casualty from deep water

Career opportunities/vocational outcomes

Include but not limited to Pool Life Guard, Pool Life guard Assistant, Pool life guard attendant.

Program Articulation

Students who successfully complete the course and have been deemed competent in all areas will be issued with a statement of attainment for the following units of competency:

SRCAQU006B Supervise clients at an aquatic facility or environment

SRCAQU007B Respond to an aquatic emergency using advanced water rescue techniques

Program Duration

Full Course: 1 Day
Refresher : Workbook or Online component + Swim Test

Course Commencement

Courses commence in February, April, July and September each year for full course and part Refresher courses are all year round.

Delivery Methods

This course is delivered through blended face to face classroom learning, online learning at students' self pace or by correspondence.

Assessment Methods

Students may be required to sit written and oral exams, participate in practical activities, complete assignments, presentations, vocational projects and role plays.

Students undertaking a course as part of a work based traineeship will be assessed in the workplace.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Participants with previous training and/or experience may apply for RPL. Participants, who have completed courses with equivalent / matching learning outcomes, will be granted credit transfer.

Accreditation
