



HLT50407 Diploma of Paramedical Sciences (Ambulance)

This qualification covers workers employed by State Ambulance authorities and non-emergency transport companies to provide emergency and non-emergency client care and transport services.

Program Articulation

Students who successfully complete the core units of this qualification may gain articulation into the Advanced Diploma of Paramedical Sciences. You may also gain advanced standing in other Cert IV and Diploma qualifications.

Program Duration

- Full Time:** 8 months
- Part Time:** 16 months

Course Commencement

Courses commence in February, April, July and September each year for full time and part time applicants.

Delivery Methods

This course is delivered through blended face to face classroom learning, online learning at students' self pace or by correspondence.

Assessment Methods

Students may be required to sit written and oral exams, participate in practical activities, complete assignments, presentations, vocational projects and role plays.

Students undertaking a course as part of a work based traineeship will be assessed in the workplace.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Participants with previous training and/or experience may apply for RPL. Participants, who have completed courses with equivalent / matching learning outcomes, will be granted credit transfer.

Course Structure
